# **IMPACT REPORT 2025**



## A Message from the Chief Executive Officer

As the close of 2025 fast approaches, we pause to reflect on the year with profound gratitude, echoing the words of Samuel: "Ebenzer- thus far the Lord has helped us" (1 Samuel 7:12). 2025 marks a significant milestone in our organizational journey: the 20th anniversary of the Leadership Institute of Zambia (LIZA), formerly known as the Leadership Institute of Southern Africa (LISA). Adding personal significance to this institutional celebration, 2025 also commemorates 40 years of my pastoral ministry. In essence, we are celebrating a remarkable 20/40 milestone - twenty years of institutional impact intertwined with four decades of my ministry service dating back to September 1985 when I started as an Assistant Pastor in the Chipata Pilgrim Wesleyan Church.

Our official 20th anniversary celebration is scheduled for 25th January, 2026, which is also Muumbe's birthday. Brian Maydew, Kim Lubeck, one of the owners of Quality Pork International Inc. (QPIL), Brandon and Tera Maydew will visit Zambia to join us in commemorating this landmark achievement. The four are our strategic anchor partners through their company QPIL.

### Partnerships and Ministry Collaborations

The cornerstone of our annual operations remains the meaningful engagement with partners whose prayer support and financial commitment keep our ministry initiatives advancing. This year, we were privileged to host several distinguished visitors and ministry partners.

The Lord also opened doors to new relationships with potential partners from the USA ministering within Zambia's broader Christian community. These include Dr. Lenox Piggott, Dr. Damon Richardson; and Prophetess Kimberly Smith. These emerging partnerships represent exciting possibilities for expanded ministry impact in the years ahead.

At the home front, we had meaningful engagements with Ministry of Youth, Sports and Art as well as Department of National Guidance and Religious Affairs under the Office of The Vice President.

The Leadership Institute of Zambia conducted its flagship History Makers Leadership Training programme, reaching a total of 474 students across nine university campuses. The institutions involved included the University of Zambia (UNZA) Main Campus, Copperbelt University (CBU), Cavendish University (CU), University of Zambia School of Medicine (UNZA-Ridgeway campus), Evelyn Hone College, University of Lusaka (UNILUS), Zambian Royal Medical University, St. Eugene DMI University, and the Natural Resources Development College (NRDC).

## **Medical Supplies Distribution**

In a bid to bolster Zambia's healthcare sector, the Leadership Institute of Zambia distributed medical supplies and equipment to several facilities. Beneficiaries included Kanyama in Lusaka, Mtendere Hospital in Chirundu, Jembo Rural Health Centre in Pemba, Siachitema Rural Health Centre in Kalomo district, and Zimba Hospital in Zimba.

## **Education Sector Support**

The Institute also made significant contributions to the education sector, supporting Pilgrim Wesleyan Bible College, proposed Africa Wesleyan University College, and 16 grant-aided and 4 government schools with supplies and infrastructure development. These efforts are part of the Institute's commitment to enhancing educational opportunities and outcomes in Zambia to support the government's vision to provide quality education.

## **Orphans and Vulnerable Children Support**

In Kanyama compound in Lusaka, and Muuka and Siansowa villages in Sinazongwe district, the Leadership Institute of Zambia supported orphans and vulnerable children in primary and secondary schools. This initiative aimed to promote education and reduce barriers to learning for disadvantaged children.

## **Educating Future Leaders (EFL) Scholarship Programme**

Furthermore, the Institute provided scholarships to 96 college and university students through its 'Educating Future Leaders' project. This programme seeks to empower the next generation of leaders by providing them with access to higher education and skills development opportunities in preparation for leadership in various sectors.

## **Economic Empowerment Project**

In its Economic Empowerment Project, the Leadership Institute of Zambia supported Pilgrim Wesleyan Church pastors and lay people with financial assistance for their agricultural projects. In Kanyama compound, six young men were trained in welding and were given equipment and tools to establish their own welding business. This initiative aimed to promote economic sustainability and self-reliance among the beneficiaries.

## OUR MINISTRY FOCUS AREAS

With the support of our cooperating partners, we were able to do the following in each of our five ministry focus areas: Leadership Training; Evangelism and Church Planting; Education Support; Health Support and Economic Empowerment.

### 1. LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Our flagship History Makers Leadership Training initiative experienced unprecedented growth in 2025, demonstrating the hunger among Zambia's emerging generation for biblical and transformative leadership principles. While 2024 saw us train 105 church leaders and 101 tertiary students, this year witnessed exponential expansion with 474 students trained across nine institutions of higher education.

#### 3.1 Educating Future Leaders (EFL) Scholarship Project

Education remains one of the most powerful catalysts for sustainable development. Through our EFL project, we provided scholarships to 96 tertiary students pursuing studies across 32 colleges and universities throughout Zambia. These scholars represent diverse fields including medicine, nursing, education, agriculture, communications, and public administration just to mention a few.

#### **Two EFL beneficiaries selected to study in Russia and Israel:**

We are delighted to report that Brian Msiska, an orphan whom we started sponsoring while he was in 10th grade at Jembo Secondary and now at Mulungushi University, was one of three students who were selected to pursue an 11 months internship in Israel. 


### 3.3 Playground Donation



### 3.4 Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVC)

We provided educational support to:

83 orphans and vulnerable children in Kanyama Township, Lusaka

\*.....across multiple communities, including Muuka, Sikuteka, and Siansowa villages in Sinazongwe District; Sibanyati Settlement in Choma District; Zimba in Zimba District; and Sichibeya in Kalomo District. Our uniform project removes a significant barrier to education access, enabling these children to attend school with dignity and confidence alongside their peers.

### 4. Community Health Support

Healthcare accessibility remains a critical challenge in many Zambian communities, particularly in rural areas. In 2025, LIZA distributed medical equipment and supplies to strategic health facilities:

- Zimba Mission Hospital, Zimba District
- Mtendere Mission Hospital, Chirundu District
- Jembo Rural Health Centre, Pemba District
- Siachitema Rural Health Centre, Kalomo District
- Kanyama Level 1 Hospital, Lusaka

These donations enhance diagnostic capabilities, improve patient care quality, and extend the operational capacity of facilities serving some of Zambia's most vulnerable populations.

## 5. Relief and Economic Empowerment (Poverty Alleviation)

With the support from our cooperating partners, we provided relief mealie meal to Pilgrim Wesleyan Church pastors through the office of the Presiding Bishop. Sustainable community transformation requires economic opportunity. Our economic empowerment initiative provided financial support to four pastoral families for agricultural projects, enabling them to develop sustainable income streams while maintaining their ministry commitments. Additionally, we supported Mr. & Mrs. Simpunji in Chawama township with their tailoring project. At personal level, for more than five years Mrs. Simpunji has been making our matching Chitenge outfits, which have been appreciated by those who see us in the outfits.

These investments model a holistic approach to ministry that addresses both spiritual and material needs, demonstrating the gospel's comprehensive concern for human flourishing.

### CONTAINER PROJECT

In 2025, LIZA received and distributed five containers of donated supplies, significantly amplifying our capacity to serve communities across multiple sectors. We extend deep appreciation to the New Dawn Government under His Excellency President Hakainde Hichilema for creating an enabling environment that facilitates partnerships between faith based organizations and international donors in service of Zambian citizens.


